**Re:** Letter of support for boundary adjustments to the University and Ansell/Crispo properties

Dear Property Development and Planning Committee,

As the President of the Laurentian University Alumni Association, I am pleased to provide the following letter to support Drs. Ansell and Crispo, two distinguished Laurentian University Alumni, in their proposal to exchange lands with the University for the purposes of ensuring uninterrupted access to the Laurentian University trail network and resolving a previously disclosed encroachment on University property.

Collectively, Drs. Ansell and Crispo have successfully completed a total of five Laurentian University-based training programs, including studies at the undergraduate and graduate levels and at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine. Prior to their recent return to Sudbury to serve the community as an Emergency Physician and Health Services/Outcomes Researcher, respectively, Drs. Ansell and Crispo excelled in their training at the University of Ottawa and University of Pennsylvania, two institutions that are internationally recognized for their exceptionally strong research-based training programs. Sudbury is very fortunate to have recruited and retained these accomplished Laurentian University Alumni to the north.

Drs. Ansell and Crispo have met with me to discuss trespass and encroachment issues that are adversely affecting their recently purchased property. Specifically, users of the Laurentian University trail network frequently trespass on their property to access the University's multi-use trails, and Drs. Ansell and Crispo have recently learned that their property's residential use encroaches on lands owned by the University. In effort to mutually resolve these issues, Drs. Ansell and Crispo have generously proposed to exchange equal amounts of land with the University, which I fully support.

In these matters, Drs. Ansell and Crispo continue to demonstrate model qualities of Laurentian University Alumni; mainly leadership, integrity, creativity, and professionalism. Upon discovering defects with their residential property, they have disclosed such defects to the University and proposed a reasonable and fair resolution to these matters, which is beneficial to all parties.

In closing, I fully endorse Drs. Ansell and Crispo's proposal to exchange lands with the University for the purposes of resolving the above-described matters.
